

























































Hieroglyphics represented the written language of ancient Egypt. Their exact meaning was a mystery until the discovery of a stone at Rosetta, 35 miles from Alexandria, in 1799. The stone, now in the British Museum, has three inscriptions – one in hieroglyphics, another in modern Egyptian and a third in Greek. Thus for the first time the strange symbols could be translated and archaeological research began in earnest. 40
